## Dear Sirs,

The upcoming NATO Summit in Vilnius will once again test the resolve of the Allies to provide support to Ukraine and show a strong united front of the collective West to the aggressor state Russia and its leader Vladimir Putin. The purpose and resilience of the alliance is being tested again and again, and therefore, we, the World Federation of Free Latvians, encourage NATO leaders to send clear signals and take strong actions out of the Vilnius Summit.

As the umbrella organization for the hundreds of thousands of Latvians living in Europe, the United States, Canada, Australia, Russia and South America, we, the World Federation of Free Latvians:

- Thank NATO leadership for the recent bold change of defense and deterrence policies in regard to
  protecting the Baltic Nations from "occupy-then-liberate" to a "defend-every-inch" posture, but we urge
  you to commit the necessary permenant on-the-ground troops and equipment in the region to ensure
  the success of this policy.
- Encourage the Vilnius summit to provide a clear road map to Ukraine and its brave military to join the
  Alliance and to provide additional military assistance in support of Ukraine's planned 2023
  counteroffensive.
- Call on you to apply all appropriate pressure on Turkey and Hungary to ratify Sweden's membership into
  NATO. This will fortify the security of the northern Baltic Sea region and protect the peaceful people living
  in those countries by integrating their defense capabilities with NATO.
- Seek a NATO initiative to expand production capacity for weapons systems and ammunition in the Baltic countries. This will enhance NATO defense stocks while simultaneously provide stimulus for economies harmed by the war.

Latvians living in the NATO countries outside of Latvia are concerned about the security of the Baltic region in the light of Russia's war in Ukraine. NATO's needed role as a strong defensive alliance is made clearer with renewed Russian threats and actual aggression. The leaders of Western countries should stand firm for freedom, peace, and prosperity.
